## **Holiday Season**

When away on holiday enjoying your break – the last thing you want to worry about is the safety of your home. Here are 6 tips for increasing peace of mind when leaving homes unoccupied:

- Ensure all doors, windows, tools and valuables are suitably locked up or cleverly hidden avoid the sock drawer and under the bed!
- Check your household insurance policy for any exclusions that might mean you are not covered whilst you are away.
- Don't leave your house looking unoccupied leave the garden tidy, cancel any regular deliveries, user timer switches etc.
- Sign up to a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme.
- Don't tell everyone you're on holiday either locally or across social media accounts.
- Install appropriate home security measures outdoor lighting, cameras, alarms etc many nowadays have apps to monitor remotely, too.

## School's Out For Summer - Top Safety Tips

With summer finally here, school age children are home for the holidays. To coincide with that, it's time to remind ourselves of some important safety advice to pass onto our children. From water safety, to avoiding the train tracks, see below some helpful tips and links to share the knowledge and keep our children safe and happy this summer!

- Water Safety Remember to remind children about practicing safety around open water; to take notice of signage and when/where it is safe to swim. There is some really helpful guidance from Hampshire Safeguarding Children Partnership here: Water Safety Code
- Train Safety With our community being so close to several train lines, a
  gentle reminder of the dangers of trespassing on the tracks can help keep
  children safe. National Rail have some great safety advice here.

## **BBQ Season**

As the summer months appear, it may be time to dust off your BBQ and have dinner "Al Fresco". British weather is temperamental as we know, but if we are fortunate to have a few sunny days and you decide to utilise your BBQ please remember the safety points below:

# **BBQ** safety

BBQs produce carbon monoxide (CO), which is a highly poisonous gas. Without an adequate supply of fresh air it can kill quickly with no warning. Stay safe and follow these simple tips for BBQ safety.



- Never take a smouldering or lit BBQ (charcoal or gas) into a tent, caravan or cabin. Even if you have finished cooking your BBQ will still give off fumes for some hours after use.
- ✓ Never use a BBQ inside to keep you warm.
- ✓ Never leave a lit BBQ unattended or while sleeping.
- Only use appliances in accordance with the operating instructions.
- Place your cooking area well away from your tent. Always ensure there is an adequate supply of fresh air where the BBQ is being used.
- Remember the six main signs and symptoms of CO poisoning – headaches, dizziness, breathlessness, nausea, collapse and loss of consciousness. If concerned, seek medical advice immediately.
