With the nights closing in and Halloween fast approaching, we thought it pertinent to remind people how to be respectful and safe during the celebrations.

Whilst Halloween can be exciting and fun for some, for others it can be a worrying and frightening time. We would like to remind trick-or-treaters of the "Lights on" rule. If you see a decorated house with lights on, this usually means its okay to knock the door. There will, however, be some people that don't wish to partake, and unexpected knocks on the door can be scary.

Keeping your Home safe – Reminder of Key Advice!

We have seen a rise in the number of reported burglaries across the district. Statistically, this time of year does show a rise in the number of burglaries year on year. With that in mind, we would like to remind the community to remain vigilant and ensure that homes are fully secured. The Neighbourhood Watch Scheme provides invaluable advice – if you want to protect your home, think **WIDE(N)**:



W – Windows: Lock your windows

I – Interior: Put your interior lights on timer
D – Doors: Double or Deadlock your doors

E – Exterior: Put your exterior lights on timer

(N) – Neighbours: Keep an eye out for neighbours.

2024 Crime and Community Survey – Have your say!

The launch of Hampshire Police's annual survey is here and is looking at your experience of crime and your connection to your local community. The data from the survey goes into a report which they publish on their website and use to help prioritise their work.

This year they're working with academic staff at the University of Northumbria who have provided some optional questions at the end of the survey related to health. This is linked to their studies on fear of crime and health outcomes.

The survey takes about ten minutes to complete, and if you can spare the time, we really hope that you will make your views known - it really is appreciated!

Catalyst Support – Cuckooing and how to help!

Cuckooing – is this a term you have heard? Cuckooing essentially is when vulnerable people in our communities are targeted and exploited by criminals to run illegal and dangerous activity out of their homes. It happens across the country and can cause a significant

impact to not only the individual involved, but the wider community.

Funding has been provided for Catalyst to support Hart and they have been doing some excellent work in the community. It is vital that when cuckooing is taking place that the correct agencies and support can be put into place.



If you see something suspicious, have concerns for a neighbour or believe that someone you know may be the target of cuckooing please speak to either Hampshire Police or CST. We can engage and refer to Catalyst to ensure that we can intercept and support those victims.

They can also provide early intervention work for prevention where it is suspected drug activity may be occurring in or near a vulnerable person's property. Further information about the great work that Catalyst do can be found <u>here.</u>
