I am totally in agreement that the gap between settlements should be preserved as we have already seen vast areas of existing gaps eaten away by poor developments, such as Grove Farm and Edenbrook.

Crookham Village is losing its identity, as is Church Crookham and Fleet.

I have opposed development in a number of locations where they stand to, not only cause detriment to our existing infrastructure but also, threaten coalescence of settlements.

Crookham Village is a rural village and it should remain so.

Hart District Council have a Local Plan which is likely to be adopted in January 2020 and they are also currently progressing viability of a (up to) 5,000 home Garden Village within the district. HDC have been awarded £150,000 of government funding to assist with this process.

The green gap, as shown, can be and should be preserved. These are areas used regularly for leisure... walking, cycling etc and give existing residents, including my family, a peaceful escape from, often, very busy lives.

We do not need this land for future development so, please, leave this green gap as requested.
