The paper reflects the crucial importance of both the Dogmersfield and Crookham Village gaps to the setting and integrity of the historic settlement of Crookham Village and its conservation area. The purpose of a Local Gap is to prevent coalescence with neighbouring settlements and without the local gaps proposed in this paper, it is very likely that Crookham Village will merge with Dogmersfield to the north, Fleet to the east and Church Crookham to the south west within the next plan period.

The paper is an accurate and comprehensive reflection of the essential features of each section of land lying with each of the two proposed local gaps. Much of the land bordered by the proposed Local Gaps forms an essential part of the setting of the historic properties that make up the conservation area. If this were lost through development, it is likely that the conservation area itself would also, in time, be lost as historic building without their setting to give them context, are much reduced in value.

The paper also reflects the importance of both of these local gaps to the local residents as an essential source of biodiversity as well as amenity and recreation space. All of this space is traversed by public footpaths which are very well used by local residents and visitors alike. Much of the attraction for these

paths is the sense of openness coupled with a sense of safety and tranquillity. All of these are crucial to the health and wellbeing of the historic Village and its residents.

I note that the Hart Local Plan Inspector suggested that Local Gaps could be designated through Neighbourhood Plans and I endorse the efforts of this community in providing an all-encompassing justification for the designation of all the areas of land described in this paper as Designated Local Gap.
